In English classes, students learned about positive personality traits, listened to love-themed humor, and participated in group singing. This helped create a fun, uplifting atmosphere.


The enthusiastic participation, emotional resonance, group bonding, learning and reflection suggested that our students were highly engaged and responsive to the activities.



DAY 2 MATCH! MATCH!


This interactive game challenged the students to pair up and match different concepts related to self-love, relationships, and personal growth. The game required them to think critically about the connections between these important themes.
